

Using EndNote, RefWorks or Reference Manager to Download PMC ID Numbers from PubMed

PMC ID Numbers

The NIH Public Access policy requires that copies of peer reviewed papers based on NIH funded research and accepted for publication on or after April 7, 2008 be deposited in PubMed Central, the National Library of Medicine's full text repository. In order to demonstrate compliance with the policy, NIH requires investigators to include the PubMed Central identification (PMC ID) number when citing papers in NIH applications or reports if the papers were authored or co-authored by the investigator, arose from his/her award, and fall under the policy. The PMC ID number is a unique number assigned to each paper deposited in PubMed Central. It is included in the PubMed record for the paper and is usually assigned around the time the paper is published. It can be automatically downloaded from the PubMed database using EndNote, RefWorks or Reference Manager. EndNote, RefWorks and Reference Manager do not currently download the PMC ID number from Ovid Medline.

Important Note: A PMC ID number is not assigned unless the paper is submitted to PubMed Central. For more information on submitting papers, see Miner Library's NIH Public Access Policy web site:

Downloading PMC ID Numbers with EndNote

In order to capture the PMC ID number users must download three files, copy them to the correct place within EndNote, and re-title the second "custom" field in EndNote to PMC Number. (Renaming the custom field in EndNote is not necessary if you are using EndNote versions X1 or X2.) A new NIH output style that incorporates the PMC ID number is included in the files. Downloading PMC ID Numbers with RefWorks

RefWorks added a PMC ID field to every reference type and modified the import filter for NLM PubMed so that it automatically downloads the PMC ID number as part of the PubMed record and places it in the respective RefWorks field. The NIH – National Institute for Health output style displays the PMC ID number. Additionally any RefWorks output style can be modified to include the PMC ID number in the bibliography. Downloading PMC ID Numbers with Reference Manager

Reference Manager Version 12 automatically downloads PMC ID numbers from PubMed. For earlier versions of Reference Manager, users must download and install a revised PubMed import filter (Pubmed PMC.cap) and NIH Grant Style file. The files and detailed instructions are available at the following web site: <http://www.refman.com/support/faqs/Import/faq8.asp>. The new files will place the PMC ID number in User Defined 5 field for Journal Articles.
