<b>PROGRAM TITLE:</b>	Orofacial Pain Preceptorship at Eastman Institute for Oral Health
<b>COURSE CO-DIRECTORS:</b>	Drs. Ross H. Tallents and Donald Macher
<b>COURSE DATES AND DURATION:</b>	11 months (generally divided into 2 semesters (fall and spring). Expected start date is August 1 <sup>st</sup> of each year.
<b>OBJECTIVES:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• To promote the dissemination of EIOH Orofacial Pain educational model</li><li>• To be exposed to EIOH Orofacial Pain education at the postgraduate level</li><li>• To learn current concepts of Orofacial Pain</li><li>• To understand how to advance interdisciplinary treatment planning</li><li>• To understand how technology can be incorporated into Orofacial Pain</li><li>• To understand and apply basic research methodology in Orofacial Pain</li><li>• To understand proper diagnosis and treatment of patients with Orofacial pain and sleep apnea</li></ul>
<b>PROGRAM FORMAT:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The student will be involved in all didactic activities held in the Orofacial program at EIOH; this generally involve lectures, courses, CE activities, seminars, resident and faculty-led literature reviews, interdisciplinary case presentations and treatment planning, problem-based learning, long-distance presentations and remote (via Blackboard or similar) types of lecture delivery media.</li><li>• It is also expected that the student will participate in scholarly activity that are on-going within the program with the purpose of learning basic research methodology and design.</li></ul>
<b>PATIENT CONTACT:</b>	It is expected that the student will observe clinical procedures performed in the Orofacial Pain Clinic. However, the student <b><u>will not</u></b> be allowed to provide patient care.
<b>SIZE OF CLASS:</b>	2 depending on application number and eligible candidates.
<b>CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY:</b>	DDS or DMD degree from a CODA-accredited or equivalent foreign institution.
<b>IMMIGRATION STATUS:</b>	If student is a US citizen or permanent resident proof must be provided. Any student requiring visa sponsorship will be sponsored on an F-1 Student Visa.
<b>TUITION &amp; FEES:</b>	US \$25,000 + applicable mandatory health insurance fees, administration fees and any other fees assessed. All subject to change without notice.
<b>STIPEND (SALARY):</b>	The student does <b><u>not</u></b> receive a stipend (salary).
<b>CERTIFICATE:</b>	<p>A Certificate of Attendance is awarded upon successful completion of the program.</p> <p><b><u>Please note:</u></b> this program is not intended to prepare individuals to practice a specialty. It is not the same as the postgraduate program certificate awarded to full-time postgraduate students in specialty training as a qualification for recognition by the American Dental Association, nor does it qualify an individual for licensure in New York State or any other state in the United States.</p>
