Description:

The National Center for Biomedical Research and Training at Louisiana State University (NCBRT-LSU) will be presenting this course. This course provides a brief overview of biological incidents that have occurred; biological agents that are naturally occurring, could be accidentally released, or could be used deliberately; the typical course of disease and how that may vary in a deliberate incident; an overview of biological agents as terrorist weapons; and methods of protection from biological agents (with an emphasis on protection using methods and equipment readily available to emergency responders and the general public).

- Successful completion of a WMD awareness-level training course.
- Completion of ICS-100 and 200 and IS-700 and 800 is recommended but not required.
