CDC Updates Infection Control in Healthcare Personnel — CDC recently updated [Infection Control in Healthcare Personnel: Epidemiology and Control of Selected Infections Transmitted Among Healthcare Personnel and Patients \(cdc.gov\)](#). The recommendations in this document update the 1998 recommendations with current guidance on the management of exposed or potentially infectious healthcare personnel (HCP).

This document is intended for use by the leaders and staff of Occupational Health Services (OHS) and to guide OHS in the management of exposed or infected HCP who may be contagious to others in the workplace.

Key Information to Know:

- This update does not provide recommendations about other aspects of infection prevention and control, such as environmental infection control and isolation precautions for patients.
- New topics in the update include expanded information regarding defining occupational exposures in healthcare settings and descriptions of clinical features of each disease. The new sections available in this March 2024 PDF include measles, mumps, rubella, varicella, and special populations: pregnant healthcare personnel. Additional updates are forthcoming.
- The updated recommendations in these sections focus on postexposure management, including postexposure prophylaxis (PEP), for exposed HCP and work restrictions for exposed or infected HCP.
- The recommendations are informed by reviews of the 1998 Guideline; current CDC resources, guidance, and guidelines; and new resources and evidence, when available. Additionally, the recommendations are classified as good practice statements based on the expert opinions of the authors and the Healthcare Infection Control Practices Advisory Committee (HICPAC).

Research Gaps in Patient & Healthcare Personnel Safety Priority Research Questions to Drive Improvement

For the first time, CDC's Division of Healthcare Quality Promotion is releasing a list of unanswered research questions to drive improvements in patient and healthcare personnel safety, including combating healthcare threats like [antimicrobial resistance](#) and [sepsis](#). After investing more than \$500 million in healthcare research innovations, we're hopeful that researchers and partners will join us in accelerating this critical science for patient and healthcare worker safety, using this list to inform decisions such as strategic planning.

On any given day, about 1 in 31 hospital patients and 1 in 43 nursing home residents have at least one [healthcare-associated infection](#) (HAI), and at least [35,000 people die](#) from antimicrobial-resistant infections each year. HAIs can have devastating effects on physical, mental/emotional, and financial health. In addition, they cost billions of dollars in added expenses to the healthcare system.

Answers to these questions will help the U.S. "get to zero" healthcare-associated infections and move the field forward with strategies that will allow for safer and more equitable health care.

NEW! April 11, 2024 [New Messaging: Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza \(HPAI\)](#)

On April 1, 2024, a Texas resident with exposure to dairy cattle tested positive for highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) A(H5N1), also known as bird flu and avian influenza. Despite this recent human case of HPAI A(H5N1), **the current outbreak is considered an animal health issue at this time, primarily affecting wild birds, poultry, and some mammals.** However, some precautions, particularly by people who work with animals, may be advisable.

NEW! April 4, 2024: Prepare Today for Peace of Mind Tomorrow

Picking up the pieces of your life after a disaster can be challenging. One of the most important things that may help you recover faster from a disaster is increasing your financial resilience. Being financially resilient will prepare you to quickly recover from the financial impacts caused by natural disasters and unexpected emergencies. You can take action to increase your financial resilience by:

- Using [Financial Literacy and Education Commission \(FLEC\)](#) resources to boost your financial knowledge. FEMA, in partnership with the FLEC, is celebrating National Financial Capability Month (NFCM) throughout April. NFCM focuses on financial literacy and ensuring Americans have access to unbiased and trustworthy financial education and resources. Visit FLEC's [MyMoney.gov](#) to get financial preparedness advice for you and your family members. Take time to learn about financial preparedness to increase your financial resilience.
- Downloading FEMA's free [Emergency Financial First Aid Kit \(EFFAK\)](#). Developed in partnership with Operation HOPE, the EFFAK helps keep all your important information at your fingertips by making it easy to organize critical financial, medical and household information. The kit includes checklists and forms to help you gather the documents you will need after an emergency or disaster. It also provides tips on storing and safeguarding your personal information. The EFFAK is available for download in six languages – [English](#), [Spanish](#), [simplified Chinese](#), [traditional Chinese](#), [Korean](#) and [Vietnamese](#). An [English language large print edition](#) is also available.
- Reviewing your insurance policies to ensure you have the correct amount and type of coverage for the hazards you are at risk of experiencing. Homeowner's insurance policies do not typically cover flooding. Learn about your community's flood risk and find out if your home is in a flood zone by visiting [Floodsmart.gov](#). Discuss what you learn with your insurance representative to determine if you need flood insurance. You can also review how to [buy flood insurance](#) at the [National Flood Insurance Program](#) website.
- Learning how to identify scams. Be wary of phone calls, emails and text messages from people or companies you don't know, especially if the person is trying to convince you to send them money. Do not click on links in texts or emails from people you don't know. Scammers can send an email, text or link that appears to be from a reputable credit card company or financial institution that requests account information, often suggesting that there is a problem. Scammers may also try to take advantage of financial fears by calling with work opportunities,

debt consolidation offers and student loan repayment plans. Finally, never open an attachment or click on a link sent to you in an unsolicited email. Cleverly crafted links can take you to forged web sites set up to trick you into divulging private information or downloading viruses, spyware and other malicious software. Minnesota Train Derailment Proves Value of CERT Program

When a train derailment caused a fire in downtown Raymond, Minnesota last spring, first responders jumped into action. Despite being the middle of the night, they weren't alone. Members of the Willmar Area Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) joined first responders to help most of the small city — about 800 people — evacuate to the town of Prinsburg.

CERT teams are sponsored by local public safety agencies and trained to provide much-needed assistance in an emergency. The Willmar Area CERT is coordinated by the Willmar Police Department and Kandiyohi County Emergency Management with help from Minnesota's Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM) division and FEMA.

"CERT is an example of how great public private partnerships can be," said interim HSEM Director Kevin Reed. "Private individuals step up to help their community, adding to the resources provided by public servants."

In the immediate aftermath of an emergency, CERT volunteers work together to meet the needs of individuals affected by the emergency. In Raymond, officials called in CERT members around 2 a.m. to help law enforcement officers and firefighters knock on doors and let residents know about the fire and evacuation.

CERTs Work to Serve More Members of the Community

In emergencies, individuals and communities depend on effective, timely information they can trust and understand. CERTs play a vital role in disaster preparedness and response by empowering ordinary citizens to assist their communities in times of need. Because CERTs are often the first line of defense when disaster strikes, ensuring they are representative of the whole community is an essential step toward improving resilience.

A recent initiative by the [Arkansas Division of Emergency Management \(ADEM\)](#) provided CERT training tailored to the needs of the Deaf and hard of hearing community. Led by ADEM Community Preparedness Coordinator Gary Ragen, the two-day training took place in December 2023 and gave participants the knowledge and skills they need to help themselves and others during an emergency.

Individuals who are Deaf or hard of hearing often face unique challenges during emergencies, including difficulties accessing critical information and communicating with emergency responders. Offering CERT training specific to their needs is not just important to the Deaf community, it also benefits first responders by making it easier for them to adapt to any situation or individual they encounter. As Ragen explained, "this was an opportunity to bridge a gap and make sure that the Deaf and hard of hearing community are able to communicate with their government agencies and to reciprocate and learn about each other's needs."

New "Disaster Mind" Game Teaches Importance of Disaster Preparedness

A new online educational game designed to teach high school students about decision making during disasters is now available! [Disaster Mind](#) was developed by [FEMA Region 8](#) in partnership with [iThrive Games Foundation](#), a Massachusetts-based nonprofit that uses game design and game-based learning tools to help students develop skill sets that support their mental health and well-being.

Disaster Mind challenges and encourages participants to make critical decisions in the face of three simulated disaster scenarios: a flood, a wildfire and a blizzard. Complicating their quest, a mysterious guide creates challenges for the participants during game play.

"*Disaster Mind* is a new and fun way for FEMA to empower students with preparedness information as they transition from high school into the next stage of their lives," said FEMA Region 8 Administrator Nancy Dragani. "The game provides a safe environment for players to develop their decision-making skills and practice taking quick action to help others."

Prepare for Hurricane Season with FEMA's Hazard Information Sheets

FEMA's mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. One tool FEMA uses to help people prepare for disasters is its hazard information sheets. Hazard information sheets are short, two-page summaries of research-based guidance and advice for actions you should take to prepare for, protect against and recover from specific disasters or hazards. FEMA develops hazard information sheets based on the research it conducts through its [Protective Actions Research](#) program.

As hurricane season approaches, take time to understand and prepare for how a hurricane could affect you. You can start your hurricane preparedness efforts by downloading FEMA's [Hurricane Hazard Information Sheet](#). Because hurricanes and other weather related events can result in power outages, you should also prepare yourself and your family for the loss of power by downloading FEMA's [Power Outage Hazard Information Sheet](#). You can also continue your hurricane preparedness efforts by observing the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's [National Hurricane Preparedness Week](#) from May 5 to 11.

About FEMA's Hazard Information Sheets

FEMA evaluates peer-reviewed articles and develops fact- and research-based actionable disaster preparedness messaging. The agency works with emergency management subject matter experts to ensure the guidance contained in the hazard information sheets is current and valid. The sheets include key actions that can reduce harm and save lives. Knowing the protective actions to take during specific hazards helps you learn what you should — and shouldn't — do to prepare for and respond to a disaster.

FEMA-Prepare Email Review

FEMA's Individual and Community Preparedness Division (ICPD) uses the FEMA-Prepare@fema.dhs.gov email account to respond to inquiries from the public. This direct line of communication ensures transparent and efficient communication to help individuals and communities prepare for disasters.

At the start of 2024, ICPD staff discovered that a queue of email inquiries dating back to 2022 had not received a response from our team due to a technical issue.

ICPD immediately initiated a case-by-case review of email messages received during this timeframe. The division is in the process of replying to every pending inquiry that requires a response from our subject matter experts. We plan to complete this process by April 30. Additionally, our team conducted a thorough assessment of the system that manages the FEMA-Prepare@fema.dhs.gov account and updated our internal processes to mitigate any future deficiencies.

ICPD prides itself on providing the highest levels of customer service to individuals and community organizations. In this instance, we failed to meet that high standard. We apologize to any members of the public impacted by this technical issue.

National Fire Academy News: March 27, 2024

The U.S. Fire Administration's National Fire Academy (NFA) has moved away from the twice-a-year application period for students to apply for resident courses offered at the National Emergency

Training Center in Emmitsburg, Maryland. This decision was made after receiving student and stakeholder feedback.

We are now using a quarterly enrollment process and are accepting applications from career and volunteer fire and EMS personnel, along with allied professionals, to apply for resident classes scheduled from July to September 2024. Applications can be submitted through April 15, 2024.

NFA resident classes are offered free of charge with lodging provided on campus to those selected to attend in addition to travel reimbursement and transportation to and from BWI Airport. The cost to attendees is their time and purchasing a meal ticket on campus.
