He has authored or co-authored numerous peer-reviewed scientific articles and abstracts, and lectures extensively around the world on implants and esthetic dentistry. He maintains a private practice limited to prosthodontics, implant and esthetic dentistry in Louisville.

He completed his dental training at the University of Sydney and his Prosthodontics training at the University of Iowa.

Enhancing Esthetic Outcomes Through Evolution in Techniques and Materials

Esthetic Implant –based restorations are a cornerstone of contemporary practice. Treatment is often advanced or complex, and patients present with multiple issues capable of increasing the chances of a negative experience. This presentation will discuss the objective categorization of treatment difficulty. Patient treatments will be incorporated to identify a range of factors that should be considered in assessment and planning, and the influence each may have on outcome. The importance of team members, and contemporary clinical treatment options, to the esthetic outcome will be considered.

- Pre-treatment assessment of esthetic risk and application.
- Choice of implant and abutment morphology.
