## Coffee in the Library

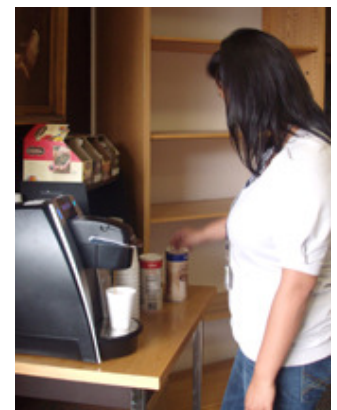
### *Bibby Library offers Coffee Service*

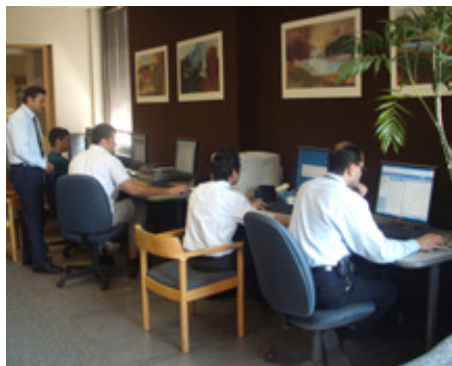

Each year, incoming residents participate in library orientation. After a discussion about library services, we demonstrate use of our many electronic resources.

In addition, residents are given a clinical question to answer using PubMed. This exercise affords them the opportunity to enhance searching skills, explore the database, and find full-text for articles of interest.

## NIH Public Access Policy

### *Did You Know?*

- The National Institute of Health (NIH) has mandated that published results of all NIH funded research be made accessible to the public?
- Authors are required to submit an electronic copy of their final peer-reviewed manuscript to PubMed Central, a digital repository maintained by the National Library of Medicine, where it will become available to the public.
- Compliance with the policy is required, and will be considered a term and condition of grant awards or cooperative agreements, in accordance with the NIH Grants Policy Statement.
- Staff at both Bibby and Miner libraries can help you with the submission process, or any questions you may have about the policy.
