# Principles of the Literature Review

## Library Staff offers in-class services.

During the spring semester, staff at Bibby library were invited to speak in Drs. Billings and Kopycka-Kedzierawski's *Introduction to Oral Epidemiology* class.

Our objective was to help the residents gain a better understanding of the research process.

Using the National Library of Medicine's *PubMed* database, we walked residents through a basic search, showing them how to narrow their topics and how to select reliable resources.

Residents were excited to learn how to combine searches, how to use the single citation matcher and how to link directly to full-text articles.

The library has been invited to teach the class again next year.

# Archive Images Help to Make Connections

## **School for Dental Hygiene Alumni Sees Her Younger Self Pictured in RDH Journal**

On her way to a conference in 2006, dental hygienist Catherine Draper met a passenger who had been a dental hygienist for 40 years. From their conversation Draper learned that three generations of her fellow traveler's family all practiced dental hygiene.

That conversation inspired Draper to write an article, titled *Dental hygiene through the generations* for [RDH Journal](#). While researching, Draper came across some of Bibby library's historical images, which are accessible on the internet through *UR Research*, the university's institutional repository.

Draper contacted the library for permission to use the photographs. The article, published in May, featured an alumni of the School for Dental Hygiene and her family.

Weeks later, Patricia Lee of Arizona was thumbing through her issue of RDH. Imagine her surprise when she saw a picture of herself working with a patient during the 1950's.

Lee, also an alumni of the School for Dental Hygiene, did some research of

her own and found the Bibby library website and its historical photo displays.

Patricia used our "Ask a Librarian" link to introduce herself and identify the others in the picture, who were unknown to us. "I was so surprised to see my picture that I just had to contact you", wrote Lee.

By making the archive photographs accessible, the library is creating new connections and filling in the gaps of the rich history that makes the Eastman Dental Center what it is today.
