Dr. Lee F. Rogers is a distinguished radiologist with a national and international reputation. Dr. Rogers obtained the M.D. degree from Northwestern Medical School in 1959 and completed residency in Diagnostic Radiology at Fitzsimmons General Hospital at Denver, Colorado. He served as a Professor and Chairman of the Department of Radiology at Northwestern University Medical School in Chicago for 21 years. In the period 1995-2004 he was the Editor-in-Chief of the American Journal of Roentgenology and the I. Meschan Distinguished Professor of Radiology at Wake Forest University School of Medicine in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Currently Dr. Rogers is a Clinical Professor of Radiology at the University of Arizona. Dr. Rogers is the author of three books and more than 100 editorials. He has received numerous awards including the gold medals of the American College of Radiology, American Roentgen Ray Society, Association of University Radiologists, Chicago Medical Society, and the Founder's Medal of the International Skeletal Society.
