

CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Define capacity; state common problems in assessing capacity and underlying causes; describe how to approach capacity evaluation; and describe models for specific capacities.
- Identify atypical presentations of infections in institutionalized older adults and be able to treat and implement preventative therapies for a number of common infections in this population.
- State the key components required for comprehensive evaluating and prescribing a rational approach to managing chronic pain in older adults.
- Describe the nature of altruism, and its importance as a means to "matter" and achieve meaning in later life.
- Describe the major classes of medications for the treatment of Alzheimer’s Disease (AD) and their mechanisms of action, as well as an awareness of safety, tolerability and efficacy data for the dementia medications. Participants will also be able to detail how new treatment options influence the standard of treatment for AD.
- Describe the unique needs and treatment goals for older patients with hypertension.

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE...

This conference will provide geriatric health professionals throughout the continuum of care with clinical and practical topics relevant to health practice with older adults. These topics were selected because they represent areas of need as identified by participants and faculty who provide health care to older adults. Some topics represent increasing clinical concerns in the geriatric population. Other topics represent areas that have important policy, cost and legal implications for health care providers and ultimately affect the way services are provided to older patients.

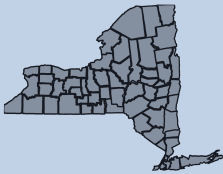
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LOCATION & DIRECTIONS

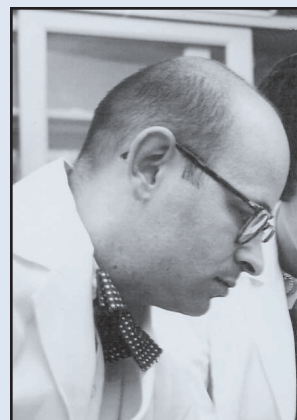
