
DIVISION OF GENETICS

The Division of Genetics is an interdepartmental division. Its present members have appointments in the Departments of Medicine, Pediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Neurology, Oncology, Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, and Microbiology and Immunology.

Division members engage in a variety of research, educational, and service activities. Their research deals with the genetics of higher organisms, man in particular, with special emphasis on human genetic disease. Research training is offered to medical students, to graduate students, and to individuals holding an M.D. or Ph.D. degree.

Faculty of the Division offer a variety of genetic patient services, including diagnostic consultation and genetic counseling; they also offer a variety of genetic laboratory services and are concerned with the development of improved diagnostic methods. Opportunities for training in medical genetics is offered to medical students and to the residency staff. Research is also conducted on the evaluation of genetic services.
