Student Contract:

-All students are required to sign a student learning contract on the first night of instruction.

Attendance:

-Students are required to attend each session scheduled. Students will notify the instructor(s) in advance of tardiness/absence from class(s). Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action. In the event of an absence from any scheduled class, it shall be the student's responsibility to arrange make-up all assignments with the instructor.

-Students will be dropped from the course at the 3rd absence.

-To be eligible to participate in the Practical Skills Exam, you must have achieved at least a 70% as a final grade and completed all course requirements. In order to be eligible to sit for the NYS Written Exam, you must have passed the NYS Practical Exam.

-All pagers, portable radios, cellular phones, etc. will be either on silent mode or turned off during classtime. Excessive use of these items, unless work-related or previously approved by an instructor, will not be tolerated and the student shall be subject to disciplinary action.

-All students must strictly adhere to the UR Student Manual of Policies and Procedures. Any violation shall be initially mitigated by the instructor and subsequently reported to UR Course Coordinator.

Class Preparation:

Noted chapter readings, manuals, homework are to be completed PRIOR to the start of each session. Quizzes will be given at the beginning of each session based upon material covered in the readings and based upon NYS protocols. As there are conflicts in the material stated in the Brady text and NYS Protocols, NYS Protocols will always supersede the Brady text. Any questions, please see the instructor.

Relevant notes may be sent to students prior to lectures via student email. It is the student's responsibility to send the instructor his/her email address and print out the notes pages prior to each session and bring them to class.

Testing:

All quizzes and exams will be based upon text assignments and NYS Protocols. Final grades are reported to the college and are based upon the Exams, CPR and AED written test, and completion of all assignments. A passing score of 70% is expected on all materials. Plagiarism will not be tolerated in any form and will be dealt with swiftly and severely.

 - 20 pts attendance/timely
 - 20 pts timely completion of assignments
 - 20 pts timely completion of hospital times requirements/obs time

Class Cancellations:

Cancellation of a class will be at the discretion of the instructor or via the college as due to a significant emergency. The college should make cancellations for evening classes before 1500.

Clinical Observations/Physicals:

Students must obtain medical clearance before the start of the course.

Arrangements will be made for a 10 hour clinical observation in an area hospital and/or ambulance observation. This must be completed PRIOR to admittance to the NYS Practical Skills Exam. See NYS Student Guide pp 6-46ff.

Students are responsible to make arrangements to complete physicals, NOT THE INSTRUCTOR.
