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Introduction

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The Deaf Wellness Center (DWC)

The DWC seeks to advance the quality of life for persons for whom hearing loss is a significant aspect of their identity and/or experience. The current DWC mission is threefold, being dedicated to

- **Clinical service** 1.
- 2. Teaching
- 3. Research

Expanding clinical services has been challenging due to high demand for DWC's limited, valuable services. Recent changes in staffing provide an opportunity to elevate the mission, allowing DWC to continue playing a leading role in advancing the field of psychology for individuals that are Deaf or Hard-of-Hearing.

Needs Assessment

- The **goal** is to conduct a thorough needs assessment by building focus groups comprised of key stakeholders within the Deaf and Hard of Hearing communities in Rochester and the Department of Psychiatry
- To ensure accessibility for those using sign language on small devices, the virtual focus groups will run for 60-90 minutes with a max of three participants
- Community groups will be conducted by someone fluent in ASL. The groups will be recorded and coded at a later date

Methods: Focus Groups


