Objectives: Participants will learn best practice paradigms in routine endoscopic care and the latest advances in therapeutic and interventional endoscopy.

Target audience: GI nurses, technicians and mid-level providers who are interested in improving their endoscopy practice and learning about new technologies, techniques and devices in endoscopy.

Format: Didactic lectures, live case presentations and a “hands-on” workshop utilizing models, animal explants and live animal platform. The program will focus on current general and advanced endoscopic therapies for treatment of benign and malignant disorders of the gastrointestinal tract, liver, pancreas and biliary system.

 - 2) Learn the indications, contraindications and complications of various general and advanced endoscopic procedures.
 - 3) Learn best endoscopic practice paradigms for general endoscopic procedures.
 - 4) Discuss advances in endoscopic evaluation and management of pancreatic cancer.
 - 5) Understand the pathophysiology and indications for endoscopic enteral stenting.
 - 6) Review the treatment options for endoscopic therapies for esophageal, gastric and duodenal varices.
 - 7) Expand application of ERCP technologies to enhance technique and skill development.
 - 8) Explore innovation in endoscopic therapies (POEM, ESD, endoscopic suturing and closure devices, full thickness resection, and advances in endoscopic imaging).
 - 9) Examine enhanced diagnostic and therapeutic function utilizing endoscopic ultrasound.
 - 10) Observe live therapeutic endoscopy procedures (Zenkers Diverticulectomy, Barrett’s ablation, EMR, ERCP, etc.) with an interactive, panel-based case discussion.
 - 11) Participate in hands-on learning laboratory for ERCP, EUS, EMR, stents, clips, controlling a variceal bleed, and disposable device training.
