

- 9) Examine enhanced diagnostic and therapeutic function utilizing endoscopic ultrasound.
- 10) Observe live therapeutic endoscopy procedures (Zenkers Diverticulectony, Barrett's ablation, EMR, ERCP, etc.) with an interactive, panel-based case discussion.
- 11) Participate in hands-on learning laboratory for ERCP, EUS, EMR, stents, clips, controlling a variceal bleed, and disposable device training.
