COMMUNITY SERVICES PROGRAMS

The **Residential Program** provides full-time care in a family setting to small groups of children and youth with multiple disabilities and behavior management needs. The program's six residential facilities located throughout the county serve 44 residents, with six to nine in each home.

Behavior Management Services: A Family Support Services program for which each participant has a complete behavioral assessment and support plan developed specifically for them. This program includes family training, monitoring, review and oversight for each plan and participant throughout their time in the program.

Enhanced Home and Community Based Waiver Services Program entails working in the home with families who have a need for additional support. Highly trained staff work on objectives in the individual's home a few hours each day, several times/week. Other skills that may be worked on include activities of daily living such as cooking, household chores and developing consistent routines. At other times, staff will provide support in the community, which could range from going out to a movie to purchasing a meal or shopping for groceries. Therapeutic respite is housed in our Bailey Road residence, and includes residential habilitation plans and the behavior support plan for each participant

Medical Respite Program is a unique opportunity that provides day and overnight respite for children and young adults with complex medical needs. This allows parents who are caretakers to have a break from 24/7 responsibilities while providing their child a safe, caring environment. The children and youth admitted for this service receive individualized care, while also having the opportunity to engage with similar-age peers in the home environment and community-based events and outings. Families are eligible if affiliated with Mary Cariola and if approved as part of their waiver services plan.
