Monroe County Dept. of Public Health <u>Lead Poisoning Prevention Program</u> 585-753-5087	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children with blood lead levels* of ≥ 8 mcg/dL and their families (the Monroe County Dept. of Public Health will contact the family). • Children with blood lead levels* of 5-7 mcg/dL and their families who live in the City of Rochester and whose parent calls the Monroe County Dept. of Public Health (MCDPH) to ask for a home inspection. • Pregnant women in the City of Rochester who call MCDPH • Families in the City of Rochester with infants under 1 year of age who call MCDPH 	<p>A public health worker will contact the family to arrange a visit to the home which will include an inspection for lead. The person sent out by MCDPH will search for sources of lead and will explain how to prevent exposure to lead and how to keep blood lead levels down. If lead sources are found, property owners will be notified and will need to repair them.</p> <p>For children with blood lead levels* of ≥ 8 mcg/dL, the Health Department will also case manage and coordinate care with the child's doctor.</p> <p>Family receives: lead dust cleaning kit, fire safety equipment, healthy home educational materials, etc.</p>	<p>Homeowner or landlord must fix lead hazards using lead safe work practices.</p> <p>Owners receive: plastic sheeting, paint primer, free lead safe work practice training (required), loan of Monroe County owned HEPA vacuum.</p>

Low income residents receive free supplies and information and complete a brief survey.</p>	<p>Resident should call the Healthy Neighborhood Program to schedule a home visit.</p>

*Blood lead levels must be from a vein. If it is a fingerstick, the child needs to have a confirmatory test from a vein.

Jeanette Hernandez 585-325-7550 x 301 jhernandez@abcinfo.org</p>	<p>Two programs:</p> <p>City of Rochester homeowners in pre-1978 homes with children under 6 years and whose income is within program limits.</p> <p>City of Rochester landlords whose pre-1978 rental property has no more than four apartments and who are renting to families whose income is within program limits.</p>	<p>Homeowners: Lead hazard control assistance such as: entry door and porch repair/replacement, paint stabilization, bare soil treatment and general rehabilitation.</p> <p>Landlords: Lead hazard control assistance. Priority to homes where children < 6 live, and those that house children with elevated blood lead levels.</p>	<p>Homeowners who occupy the home for at least five years are not required to pay for the work.</p> <p>Landlords are required to contribute 10% of the project cost, and must agree to maintain rents at affordable levels for a five year period.</p>
