

The Cancer Services Program of the Finger Lakes Region (CSP-FLR) works with more than 200 healthcare providers and facilities throughout the Finger Lakes to provide breast, cervical and colorectal cancer screenings at no cost for uninsured women and men.

In 2018, the Cancer Services Programs of Monroe, Livingston, Seneca, Yates, Wayne and Ontario Counties merged to form the Cancer Services Program of the Finger Lakes Region. This newly centralized six-county reach allows CSP-FLR to help even more eligible women and men throughout the region to receive important cancer screenings and services. The program is part of a network of CSPs statewide supported with funds from the State of New York.

What does CSP-FLR provide?

- Breast Cancer Screening: Mammogram and Clinical Breast Exam
 - Women ages 40 and older
 - Women under age 40 at high risk for breast cancer*
- Cervical Cancer Screening: Pap Test and Pelvic Exam
 - Women ages 40 and older
- Colorectal Cancer Screening: Fecal Immunochemical Test and Colonoscopy (for those at high risk)
 - Fecal Immunochemical Test: Women and men ages 50 and older at average risk for colon cancer
 - Colonoscopy: Women and men at increased or high risk for colon cancer*

**High-risk can only be determined by a New York State-licensed health care provider*

Follow-up and support services for abnormal screening tests

- Diagnostic (testing) services at no cost and a case manager to guide the individual through their follow-up appointments.
- Assistance enrolling eligible women and men in the New York State Medicaid Cancer Treatment Program to receive full Medicaid coverage for the entire time they are being treated for cancer.

Public education

- Group and one-to-one education and promotion of breast, cervical and colorectal cancer prevention, screening and treatment.

Who is eligible for CSP-FLR services?

Men and women who:

- Live in Monroe, Seneca, Yates, Wayne, Ontario and Livingston counties.
- Have no health insurance OR have health insurance with a cost share that is a barrier to screening.
- Meet the program rules for age, as well as income at or below 250% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.
