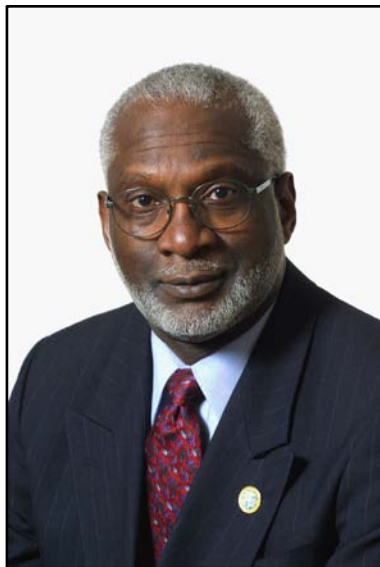

### About Dr. Satcher:

David Satcher, M.D., Ph.D., for whom the awards are named, was the 16th Surgeon General of the United States and Assistant Secretary for Health in the Department of Health and Human Services. Dr. Satcher has close ties to Rochester, having completed his residency at the University of Rochester Medical Center in the early 1970s. His tenure of public service also includes serving as Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention from 1993 to 1998, on the World Health Organization Commission on Social Determinants of Health from 2005-2009, and he is a four-star admiral in the United States Public Health Service Commissioned Corps.
