The Present Illness: American Health Care and Its Afflictions

The problems of high costs, poor access, and bad outcomes in American health care are well-recognized, but efforts to address them through policy interventions have had limited success. Three phenomena - commodification of health care, education and science, consciousness (values, attitudes, expectations, perceived needs), and problematic communication - create an environment in which all of the groups of actors in health care inhibit needed changes because they feel that they have too much at stake in the current system. Achieving needed changes requires that we confront these phenomena to be able to create the health system we need.
