Despite much higher health care expenditure than comparable countries, striking racial and ethnic disparities exist in obstetric outcomes in the United States. In the Rochester community, historic discriminatory policies remain associated with poor obstetrical outcomes, suggesting intergenerational discrimination and disinvestment continue to have a role in modern health disparities.
