

Visiting with Loved Ones

Keeping Everyone Safe Is Our Number One Priority!

Who Can Visit?

- 2 visitors are permitted throughout the hospital stay.
 - Only **1 visitor** at the bedside at a time.
 - Visitors may alternate during the day.
- Visitors must be 18 or older.

When Can You Visit?

Visiting hours are anytime between 8 am – 8 pm.

What are the Exceptions?

- Patients with COVID: No visitors unless they meet one of the other exceptions.
- Pediatric Patients: 2 designated individuals during visiting hours,
 8 am to 8 pm. For overnight guidelines, ask the unit staff.
- OB Patients in Labor: 1 identified support person and 1 visitor designated during labor. After delivery, the support person and 1 visitor may continue to visit throughout regular visiting hours.
- Behavioral Health Patients: Visiting hours from noon to 8 pm.
- Developmental Disabilities/Cognitive Impairment Patients:
 1 support person, no time limitations, as care team deems necessary.
- End-of-Life Patients: 2 individuals may visit at the same time.

Note: All patients' visitor status will be reviewed as patient's condition changes.

Unit Phone Number:

Policy for patients having surgery or a procedure in the Cardiac Cath Lab or Electrophysiology:

- Only 1 visitor may accompany patient through the pre-surgical process.
- The visitor may remain socially distanced in designated waiting rooms.
- If patient is admitted after surgery, visitation and exception guidelines will be followed.

Emergency Department and Observation Units' Visitation Policy:

- 1 visitor at a time with the patient, allowing for a second designated visitor to alternate with them, when volume and safety within the department permit. If waiting room is too busy, visitors will have to be asked to leave.
- If the patient is admitted into the hospital, but still in the ED waiting for a bed, hospital visitation and exception guidelines will be followed.

Dialysis Unit, Infusion Center, and Interventional Radiology Policy:

- Visitors are not permitted, as space does not allow for social distancing.
- Visitation exception guidelines will still be followed.

What Do You Need to Do When You Visit?

- A medical mask must be worn at all times cloth masks are not permitted.
 Those who fail to comply will be asked to leave the premises.
 - Wear your mask correctly; nose and mouth must be covered
- Wash your hands often.
 - Wash with soap for at least 20 seconds
 - Use sanitizer; ask if needed
- Individuals who are sick or suspected of having COVID may not visit.
- Upon entering the Medical Center, you will be screened for symptoms.
 - After screening, you will receive a **1 day only** visitor pass.
- Social distance, stay 6 feet apart from other people.
- Stay in your patient's room whenever possible.
 - If you smoke, please bring nicotine replacement
- When you leave the hospital, do your part:
