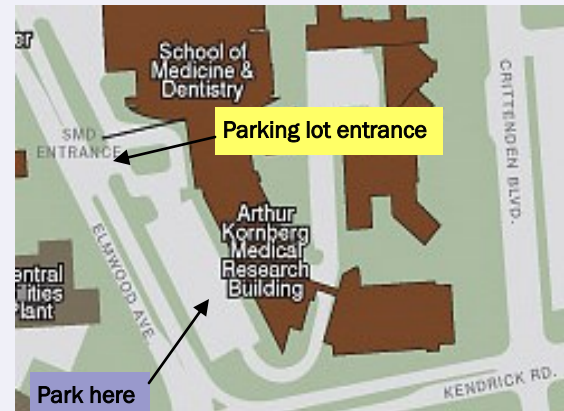

The Critical Care Nursing Symposium will enable the learner to gather practical and evidence-based knowledge through the educational sessions on the topics below:

Target Audience:

The Critical Care Nursing Symposium’s intended audience includes nurses who care for acute or critically ill patients in community and teaching hospitals. Nursing students who are interested in critical care or progressive care after graduation are also targeted.

Learning Objectives:

- Explore the qualities of an “unstoppable nurse” and describe two interventions to enhance personal resilience in a highly turbulent work environment and the resources available.
- Describe pathophysiology, screening & risk factors and treatment options of patients with Alcohol Withdrawal Syndrome, (AWS).
- Define structural heart disease, discuss the scope of the disease and outline the principles of the structural heart program.
- Describe how issues of medical malpractice are relevant in nursing’s every day practice and documentation and discuss the importance of fostering a culture of transparency and open dialogue about medical errors.
- Distinguish between different status epilepticus syndromes, defined by clinical features and EEG findings, and discuss causes, prognoses, and optimal evaluation and treatment options for patients.
- Describe the prevalence of bullying behaviors in healthcare, the effects on nurses and patient care and measures to eliminate these behaviors & establish healthy work environments.
