

NEUROCIDY Coffee Chats Scheduling Process and Requirements:

- Each scholar is responsible for scheduling his/her/their own coffee chats.
- Email faculty members with whom you'd like to meet to express your interest in meeting with them and to request scheduling of a chat depending on his/her/their availability.
- Important NOTE: Most faculty availability is limited. Therefore, scheduling will be on a first-come/first-served basis. Once each faculty member's docket of available coffee chats is filled, they are free to decline. To maximize your chance of getting a coffee chat with your top choices, we recommend reaching out right away.
- However, if you do not receive a reply from a faculty member within a couple days, please do not hesitate to email him/her/them again. Faculty get a lot of email and it's easy for an email to be unintentionally overlooked.
- Each scholar is required to do at least two or three chats. (More can be arranged with the approval of your host lab PI if additional time outside of your lab is needed for extra chats.)
- **June 16 = scheduling deadline**
 - Scheduling of your chats is to be completed by June 16; but, the chats can occur anytime during the 10-week NEUROCIDY program
