DURATION:

3, 6 and 11 months, starting dates January 1st and June 1st of each year.

OBJECTIVES: • To increase the knowledge of the participants in dental urgent care and oral surgery

PROGRAM FORMAT:

• The student will be involved in all didactic activities held in the general dentistry and oral surgery programs at EIOH; this generally involve lectures, courses, CE activities, seminars, resident and faculty-led literature reviews, interdisciplinary case presentations and treatment planning, problem-based learning, long-distance presentations and remote (via Blackboard or

similar) types of lecture delivery media.

• It is also expected that the student will participate in scholarly activity that are on-going within

the program with the purpose of learning basic research methodology and design.

PATIENT CONTACT: It is expected that the student will observe clinical procedure performed in the Howard Dental

Urgent Care clinic and the Oral Surgery clinic. However, the student will not be allowed to provide

patient care.

SIZE OF CLASS: 2-4 depending on application number and eligibility of candidates.

CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY: DDS or DMD degree from a CODA-accredited or equivalent foreign institution.

IMMIGRATION STATUS: If student is a US citizen or permanent resident proof must be provided. Any student requiring visa

sponsorship will be sponsored on an F-1 Student Visa.

TUITION & FEES: US \$10,000 (3-month), \$15,000 (6-month), \$25,000 (11-month) + applicable mandatory health

insurance fees, administration fees. All subject to change without notice.

STIPEND (SALARY): The student does **not** receive a stipend (salary).

CERTIFICATE: A Certificate of Attendance is awarded upon successful completion of the program.
