PROGRAM TITLE: Oral Biology Preceptorship at Eastman Institute for Oral Health

COURSE DIRECTOR: Dr. Robert Quivey

COURSE DATES AND DURATION:

11 months (generally divided into 2 semesters (fall and spring). Expected start date is August 1st of each year.

OBJECTIVES: • To promote the dissemination of the EIOH basic sciences educational model.

• To be exposed to basic science research at the postgraduate level.

• To learn current concepts of cell and molecular biology as it relates to oral biology.

• To understand how to conduct and participate in interdisciplinary research.

To understand and apply basic research methodology in oral biology.

PROGRAM FORMAT:

 The student will observe, and be involved in, research laboratories in the Center for Oral Biology, and in didactic activities held in the Center for Oral Biology Program at EIOH; this generally involves lectures, courses, seminars, resident and faculty-led literature reviews.

 The purpose of the program is to become familiar with current technologies in basic research methodology and design, as they apply to questions in Oral Biology.

PATIENT CONTACT: This program is focused entirely on basic and translational research. There will be **no** opportunity for the students to provide patient care.

SIZE OF CLASS:

1-3 depending on application number and eligible candidates. It is expected that the first one or two classes will enroll 1-2 students.

CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY: DDS degree from a CODA-accredited or equivalent foreign institution. We expect this program to be open, in the long-term, to dentists from different countries.

IMMIGRATION STATUS: If student is a US citizen or permanent resident proof must be provided. Any student requiring visa sponsorship will be sponsored on an F-1 Student Visa.

TUITION & FEES: US \$25,000 + applicable mandatory health insurance fees, administration fees and any other fees assessed. All subject to change without notice.

STIPEND (SALARY): The student does <u>not</u> receive a stipend (salary).

CERTIFICATE: A Certificate of Attendance is awarded upon successful completion of the program.

<u>Please note</u>: this program is not intended to prepare individuals to practice a specialty. It is not the same as the postgraduate program certificate awarded to full-time postgraduate students in specialty training as a qualification for recognition by the American Dental Association, nor does it qualify an individual for licensure in New York State or any other state in the United States.

METHODS OF EVALUATION:

- Student/s will be required to undergo a semester examination that will encompass the information provided during the lectures.
- A case-based scenario will be provided, on a semester calendar and the student assessed in his
 ability to apply sound and evidence-based knowledge to a clinical case.
