OBJECTIVES:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• To learn principles of clinical and translational dental research (3, 6 and 11-month)• To develop a clinical and translational dental research protocol (6 and 11-month)• To complete a research project following the developed protocol (11-month)		
PROGRAM FORMAT:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The student will be involved in selected didactic activities held in the general dentistry programs at EIOH; this generally involve lectures, courses, CE activities, seminars, resident and faculty-led literature reviews, interdisciplinary case presentations and treatment planning, problem-based learning, long-distance presentations and remote (via Blackboard or similar) types of lecture delivery media.• The student in the CDTR Preceptorship will be required to participate in scholarly activity that are on-going within the program with the purpose of learning basic clinical and translational research methodology and design.		
PATIENT CONTACT:	No patient contact is expected. However, should the need or desire arise the student(s) can <u>only</u> observe clinical procedures performed in the clinics. The student(s) are <u>not</u> allowed to provide direct patient care.		
SIZE OF CLASS:	2-4 depending on application number and eligibility of candidates.		
CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY:	DDS or DMD degree from a CODA-accredited or equivalent foreign institution.		
IMMIGRATION STATUS:	If student is a US citizen or permanent resident proof must be provided. Any student requiring visa sponsorship will be sponsored on an F-1 Student Visa.		
TUITION & FEES:	US \$10,000 (3-month), \$15,000 (6-month), \$25,000 (11-month) + applicable mandatory health insurance fees, administration fees. All subject to change without notice.		
STIPEND (SALARY):	The student does <u>not</u> receive a stipend (salary).		
CERTIFICATE:	A Certificate of Attendance is awarded upon successful completion of the program. <u>Please note:</u> this program is not intended to prepare individuals to practice a specialty. It is not the same as the postgraduate program certificate awarded to full-time postgraduate students in specialty training as a qualification for recognition by the American Dental Association, nor does it qualify an individual for licensure in New York State or any other state in the United States.
