DURATION:

11 months (generally divided into 2 semesters (fall and spring). Expected start date is August 1st of each year.

OBJECTIVES: • To expose the participant to advanced education in orthodontics.

• To increase the knowledge of the participant in the various aspects of orthodontics.

PROGRAM FORMAT:• The student will be involved in didactic activities held in the orthodontics program at EIOH;

this generally involve lectures, courses, CE activities, seminars, resident and faculty-led literature reviews, problem-based learning, interdisciplinary case presentations and treatment

planning.

A non-degree offering observational program.

PATIENT CONTACT: It is expected that the student will observe clinical procedures performed in the Orthodontics Clinic.

However, the student will not be allowed to provide direct patient care.

SIZE OF CLASS: 1-2 depending on application number and eligible candidates.

CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY: DDS or DMD degree from a CODA-accredited or equivalent foreign institution.

IMMIGRATION STATUS: If student is a US citizen or permanent resident proof must be provided. Any student requiring visa

sponsorship will be sponsored on an F-1 Student Visa.

TUITION & FEES: US \$32,000 + applicable mandatory health insurance fees, administration fees and any other fees

assessed. All subject to change without notice.

STIPEND (SALARY): The student does <u>not</u> receive a stipend (salary).

CERTIFICATE: A Certificate of Attendance is awarded upon successful completion of the program.

<u>Please note</u>: this program is not intended to prepare individuals to practice a specialty. It is not equivalent to the postgraduate program certificate awarded to full-time postgraduate students in specialty training as a qualification for recognition by the American Dental Association, nor does it qualify an individual for licensure in New York State or any other state in the United States.
