# ► LHP EDUCATIONAL GOALS:

- To strengthen Medical Spanish clinical skills with the goal of communicating effectively in Spanish with a Latino patient population
- To augment knowledge regarding the specific medical challenges faced by the diverse Latino population in the United States and globally
- To strengthen the relationship between medical students at the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry and the local Latino community





# ► WHO SHOULD PARTICIPATE?

- The LHP is intended for those students with at least intermediate Spanish language proficiency
- ► Enrollment is limited to 10 students each year

- ► HOW AND WHEN TO APPLY?
- ▶ October 15<sup>th</sup> Deadline for application for 1<sup>st</sup> year students
- ▶ November 8<sup>th</sup> Deadline for language assessment
- ▶ <u>December 1<sup>st</sup></u> Announcement of pathway students



# > PATHWAY REQUIREMENTS

- First year: LHP Seminar: From January to March. 8- 2 hour seminars scheduled weekly and 2 community events.
- Second year: LHP Seminar: From August to October. 8- 2 hour seminars scheduled weekly and 4 community events.
- Completion of an OSCE interviewing and completing a physical exam in Spanish (incorporated into the 2<sup>nd</sup> year seminar).



#### **PATHWAY REQUIREMENTS**

- Third/Fourth years:
  - 4 community events/year
  - A total of 4 weeks of electives related to Latino Health over the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year of medical school:
    - 2-week elective with interpreter services is highly recommended and only available to LHP students
    - Reading electives for up to 2 weeks of credit are an option. Part of this time may be used to complete your project (see below)
    - Latino Health related International Electives may count for up to 2 weeks of credit. If an international elective is completed after the first or second year of medical school in a Latino Community, this may be accepted for credit as well on a case by case basis.
    - Other Electives on a case by case basis will be reviewed

## **Community Events:**

- Self-reported activities that do not have to be related to medicine but should be an activity that involves interaction with the local Latino population. Examples include, but are not limited to:
  - health fairs
  - >religious services
  - >volunteer activities
  - Spanish chat groups
  - board meetings
  - ► Hispanic Heritage activities
  - > Festivals
  - LMSA or other events which involve a speaker from the community
  - Lectures at other institutions



## <u>Latino Health Project</u>:

- Needs to be submitted by February 1st of the Spring of your Graduation
- Goal is to pursue an interest. A literature review, a research idea, a project related to improving language skills will all be considered.
- EXAMPLE PROJECTS
  - Research/pilot projects (ex-Medical Student Attitudes toward Complementary and Alternative Medicine in Cusco, Peru, Hispanic NCDB Data & Adherence to Stage III Colon Cancer NCCN Guidelines: One Size Does Not Fit All)
  - Submitting Spanish patient education articles to a local magazine
  - Performing Spanish community outreach presentations
  - Revising or translating relevant Spanish patient information or instructions for clinical use
  - Reviewing resources used for a medical Spanish curriculum
  - Quality Assurance projects related to Latino Health
