

Pediatric Emergency Department

- The Pediatric Emergency Department of Golisano Children's Hospital at Strong, a separate entity, is located adjacent to the Adult Emergency Department at Strong Memorial Hospital.
- Approximately 28,000 visits per year.
- Serves as the tertiary care referral center and trauma center for 14 counties surrounding the Rochester area, totaling over 1 million people.
- The Division of Pediatric Emergency Medicine consists of boarded Pediatric Emergency Medicine faculty physicians and five fellows.
- Dedicated nurses focus all their efforts on the utmost quality pediatric care, and they act as essential specialists on our team, providing comprehensive care to children.



Application Process

Applications to the University of Rochester Pediatric Emergency Medicine Fellowship Program will be accepted ONLY through the Association of American Medical College 's (AAMC) Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS).

Prospective fellows are invited to interview based on information provided in the personal statement, letters of recommendation, scholastic accomplishments, and USMLE scores. It is the policy of this program to select the most qualified candidates regardless of gender, race, creed, color, national origin, handicap, age, or sexual orientation. All applicants must participate in the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP).

About our Fellowship

- Fully ACGME accredited fellowship for graduates of either EM or Pediatric residency programs.
- Program established in 1992
- Busy clinical setting including all pediatric subspecialties, and Level I Trauma unit
- Two year fellowship for EM graduates, Three year fellowship for Pediatric graduates.

Clinical Responsibilities

- PEM fellows will work significant clinical time in the Pediatric ED as well as additional required experiences.
- Required experiences include:
 - ◆ PICU
 - ◆ Pediatric Outpatient Clinics
 - ◆ Anesthesia
 - ◆ NICU
 - ◆ Child Abuse
 - ◆ Electives, including any of the pediatric subspecialties, toxicology, pre-hospital medicine, surgical subspecialties

Mentorship

- Fellows participate in special experiences where they will learn how to teach medical students, residents, and at the bedside.
- All fellows will participate in weekly teaching conferences led by pediatric emergency medicine faculty and fellows.
- Types of Conferences:
 - ◆ Journal Club
 - ◆ Case Conference
 - ◆ Morbidity and Mortality
 - ◆ Cadaver lab
 - ◆ Core Content Lectures
 - ◆ Simulation



Research

- The PEM fellowship encompasses a mentored research project (experiential)
- Research areas of interest in the department include injury prevention, health services issues, pre-hospital medicine, International Medicine, and Simulation.
- Formal course work in epidemiology, biostatistics and research methods is available.
- Fellows will also have the opportunity to pursue a Master's degree in Public Health, Science of Clinical Investigation, Medical Education or Medical Management at low cost through the University of Rochester.
- One week protected time/year, and stipend for regional/national conference attendance
