Ray Scurek	Ability of Emergency Department Providers to Predict the Results of Whole Body CT Scans in Blunt Polytrauma —This study will attempt to answer the question of whether emergency department providers, at various levels of training, can predict which CT scans obtained in blunt polytrauma will show an injury based only on history and physical exam.
Majed Refaai	Evaluation of edoxaban vs. warfarin in subjects with symptomatic venous thromboembolism (VTE) —To evaluate whether initial (Low Molecular Weight) heparin followed by edoxaban only ([LMW] heparin/edoxaban) is non-inferior to initial (LMW) heparin overlapping with warfarin, followed by warfarin only ([LMW] heparin/warfarin) in the treatment of subjects with acute symptomatic VTE for the prevention of symptomatic recurrent VTE during the 12-month study period.
