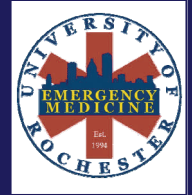

NIDA-EMF Career Development Award

The Emergency Medicine Foundation has partnered with the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) to award funds for two career development awards to support the development of research expertise in drug abuse (DA) within emergency medicine. The NIDA-EMF Career Development Award in Drug Abuse and Addiction seeks to facilitate the dissemination of research-based treatment by emergency medicine providers in the acute care setting by:

- ◆ Providing up to one-year of training and mentorship to strengthen the provider's knowledge and experience in the area of drug abuse treatment research;
- ◆ Fostering a career development relationship between the provider and an experienced mentor to guide the conduct and dissemination of research and
- ◆ Providing the provider with a preliminary data-gathering experience so that they can be successful in obtaining an NIH career development or other research award to pursue drug abuse and addiction research in subsequent years.
