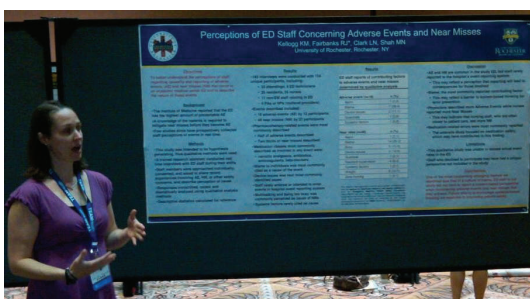

| <a href="#">Society for Academic Emergency Medicine</a> | Health Policy Fellowship | 11/1/2010 | The selected fellow will spend a one-year sabbatical experience in Washington, DC at the Department of Health and Human Services, Emergency Care Coordination Center, where he or she will work closely with the ECCC Director to review and analyze developments involving emergency care, identify areas that require federal attention, and conduct research and policy initiatives. Although applicants at any stage of post-graduate career may apply, those with greater than 5 years post-residency/fellowship training will be given preference. The award of \$75,000 may be supplemented by the awardees' department, and time will be available to work clinically . |
