Currently in her 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the PhD program, Martina's interests are focused mainly on vulnerable populations, and center around Global Emergency Medicine, Policy and Care. She is currently involved in a study evaluating the impact of Pre-Injury Anticoagulant and Platelet Inhibitor Use on Clinical Outcomes Following Traumatic Brain Injury in older adults (55 and older). Martina is the analyst on the project, applying her epidemiology skillset in this large, retrospective study of over 4500 participants. Additionally Martina is working with a team from Columbia University and the Organization sidHARTe on the Epidemiology of Injured patients presenting for care at 2 hospitals in Northern Ghana.
