### COURSE DESCRIPTION

Advanced Trauma Care for Nurses (ATCN) is an advanced course designed for the registered nurse interested in increasing his/her knowledge in the management of the multiple trauma patient. The ATCN Hybrid course utilizes components of the American College of Surgeons (ACS) Advanced Trauma Life Support® course (ATLS). The nurse will independently complete 13 on-line modules which have replaced the ATLS interactive discussions. This permits the learner to advance at their own pace. After completion of the on-line modules, learners will proceed to their registered course site to complete the skills and testing portion of the program. The Skill Stations are based on an interactive "hands-on: scenario-based approach" to adult education. The practical testing stations allow the ATCN students to demonstrate the application of ATLS and ATCN information on a moulaged simulated patient. Participants will receive both ATCN and ATLS manuals.

- •Articulate the principles of the primary and secondary surveys
- •Establish management priorities in trauma activation
