



Mr. Scott Cormier serves as Director, Emergency Preparedness and Management, for the Hospital Corporation of America (HCA). In this capacity, he oversees emergency preparedness, planning, and response for the largest private healthcare provider in the world, with 169 hospitals, 124 outpatient centers, and over 500 physician practices in 20 states and the United Kingdom. Mr. Cormier has led the response to Hurricane Gustav and Ike in 2008, which required the evacuation of four hospitals, the 2009 H1N1 Pandemic, the 2010 Nashville floods, as well as wildfires, tornados, severe winter storms, and volcanic eruptions. He has also published a number of articles on hospital preparedness and influenza patient safety, and has lectured at national and international conferences.
