Description:

Emergency Operations Plans for Rural Jurisdictions is an eight-hour, management and planning level, instructor-led course designed to provide emergency managers and rural first responders with the knowledge and skills to develop an emergency operations plan (EOP) for their respective jurisdictions. The course provides practical knowledge about the planning process, different types of EOP formats, and the components of each. Participants engage in scenarios designed to reinforce lessons learned, enable them to determine the best format for their particular jurisdictions, and to organize the various planning components into an EOP.

Topics covered include but are not limited to:

- identifies characteristics of an effective planning processes
- presents the key concepts for how to maintain a current and viable plan
- demonstrates the components of an EOP and their relationship to each other
- establishes relationship between EOP and SOP
