Psychological First Aid for Training Coordinators UASPH-CPHP 2017 PFA

Background:

Psychological First Aid (PFA) is an evidence-informed approach that provides staff and volunteers with practical ways to help people with their basic needs and immediate concerns during a disaster. The University at Albany Center for Public Health Preparedness (UACPHP) collaborated with the Institute of Disaster Mental Health at SUNY New Paltz (IDMH), the NYS DOH, the NYS OMH and other partners to develop a PFA Training Coordinator Guide. The Guide helps training coordinators tailor learning and skills based PFA activities to local needs and resources.

Purpose of Training:

This training will provide participants with the resources and knowledge needed to implement PFA training within an organization or facility.

Course objectives:

At the end of the education sessions, learners will be able to:

- Describe what PFA is and why it is important;
- Recognize the importance of PFA as a key mechanism for enhancing Workforce Resilience;
- Identify the core components of PFA;
- Identify existing online PFA courses and resources;
- Describe how to select and modify PFA training resources & scenarios for a target audience;
- Identify policies and practices to support PFA training
- Implement scenario specific interactive PFA practice based sessions to facilitate skill acquisition; and
- Identify local behavioral health resources to support PFA training activities within your organization/facility.

Target Audience:

 Public health, Hospital or other Healthcare agency (LT Care, Home Care, etc.) preparedness or emergency management coordinators who arrange or provide emergency training in their organization

Target Audience (cont.)

- Other agency training coordinators with staff who participate in emergency response, to include Emergency Management, Fire, EMS and Law Enforcement.
- Training or Volunteer Coordinators who work with volunteers who participate in emergency response, including MRC, CERT, CART, Red Cross, VOAD, etc.
