Social Media and Cyber Awareness

There is no denying the role of the Internet in our lives. It is everywhere, in our homes, our work, our phones, our cars, our refrigerators, our watches and elsewhere. And while there are untold benefits to this accessibility to the Internet, there are also concerns for the negative impact it can have on us.

Criminal cases involving Social Media have attracted significant attention in recent years, but other dangers like “**ransomware**” and “**identity theft**” are increasing. While these problems may be obvious to most people, criminals and other bad actors still find people to victimize. Many of these cases, however, can be prevented simply by having information that can keep you, your family, employees and others safe.

This presentation, will discuss recent criminal cases where social media and cyber issues were at the forefront of the investigation and how they were resolved. We will examine current cyber security threats (ransomware, for example) and look at current Social Media trends. We will also present ideas that you might use to keep you and others safe in your personal or professional life.
