Description:

The goal of this course is to assist individuals and jurisdictions that desire to develop or enhance their Emergency Operation Centers. This two-day course is designed to examine the role, design, and functions of the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and the relationships as components of a multi-agency coordination system. The course provides training about staffing and organization, information, systems, communications and equipment needs at the EOC, activating and deactivating the EOC, EOC operations and EOC training and exercising. This course will also focus on the coordination between the Incident Command System (ICS) and the decision-making procedures taking place in the EOC.

Course Objectives:

- Identify the multiple roles and responsibilities of a modern-day EOC.
- Differentiate between tactical and strategic emergency management.
- Build and manage effective organizational structures within an EOC.
- Promote effective EOC operations through plans, procedures, coordination, and documentation.
- Describe the role and challenges of an EOC during the transition to recovery.

Course Prerequisites:

IS-775 Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Management and Operations, ICS-100, ICS-200 (or Unified Command), are highly recommended prior to attending this course.
