



Psychological First Aid Technical Assistance Training

University at Albany Center for Public Health Preparedness

Background:

Psychological First Aid (PFA) is an evidence informed approach for assisting people in the immediate aftermath of disaster: to reduce initial distress and to foster short-and long-term adaptive functioning. Early interventions such as PFA can help promote a healthy recovery for individuals affected by disaster or personal crisis but many responders lack training in PFA. This in part due to a lack of subject matter expertise or behavioral health resources to help implement practice based PFA training.

Purpose of Training:

The training is intended to prepare local mental and behavioral health staff to serve as Technical Assistance Providers for Psychological First Aid (PFA) training to their Emergency Preparedness partners. The training will provide learners with an overview of the Psychological First Aid (PFA) project and the role of behavioral health professionals in fostering PFA capacity and workforce resiliency at the local level. Participants will learn how to facilitate, moderate, and evaluate the interactive PFA sessions. Participants will learn how to tailor the scenario based activities to the **role** (administration, front line, etc.), **level** (beginner, intermediate, refresher, etc.) and **setting** (hospitals, public health, shelters, home care, etc.) of emergency preparedness partners. Practice based sessions included in the training.

Course objectives:

At the end of the education sessions, learners will be able to:

- Describe PFA and the principles of PFA
- Describe the role of local mental health in developing capacity for PFA training
- Tailor training exercises to agency specific needs
- Facilitate interactive PFA practice sessions
- Evaluate skill acquisition and provide feedback to training participants
