

GOLISANO CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL



The eight-story, \$190 million, 245,000 square foot Golisano Children's Hospital is the largest capital project in the University's history. For the first time, the children's hospital will feature all-private rooms and specialized technology—including the first integrated PET/MRI in a children's hospital in the nation—dedicated to healing sick and injured children. The hospital environment was designed to minimize stress, fear and anxiety for patients and families. The new facility has 52 private rooms with space for parents to stay with their children and 68 beds in the Gosnell Family Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (44 in the Wegmans Nursery and 24 in the Strong

Memorial Hospital Nursery), providing increased privacy and more much-needed space for families and life-saving equipment. Children moved into the facility in July 2015.

Strong Children's Hospital is re-named Golisano Children's Hospital at Strong in honor of B. Thomas Golisano, local entrepreneur and philanthropist, who donates \$14 million to the children's hospital.



2011

B. Thomas Golisano announces a \$20 million gift to Golisano Children's Hospital—\$2 million more than University and Medical Center leaders expected. His lead gift jumpstarts plans to build our \$190 million standalone hospital.



2013

Groundbreaking occurs for the new Golisano Children's Hospital.

38 states plus the District of Columbia and two Canadian Provinces are homes of our donors.




