

### MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Welcome to the newsletter of the department of Health Humanities and Bioethics (HHBe). I joined as the inaugural chair in January 2023 and it has been a whirlwind. In the past 12 months, a lot has happened: The recruitment of Marc Ambrosi (administrative lead, January 2023): Erin Lee (administrative support for the masters and pathway programs, May 2023); The recruitment of 3 assistant professors: Jon Herington, PhD (August 2023), Christy Slobogin, PhD (January 2024) and Bry Moore, PhD (May 2024). We successfully captured our first grants (NIH Bioethics supplements with the CTSI and Neurology respectively). We have started a cross-campus collaboration with the Humanities Center (director Peter Christensen) on the theme of Grief. Our first speaker, Jenni Linebarger spoke on May 15, 2023, the one year anniversary of the New York Times special section naming the first 1 million Americans who had died from COVID-19. This was followed by Joshua Rasheed McFadden discussing the death of George Floyd: Patricia Caicedo discussing music and grief: and the showing of the documentary "Sisters" as part of REEL minds. The second year is expected to be as busy as the first with faculty recruitments on-going, the planning for a Regional Ethics Conference (April 2024), and more activities on Grief on the calendar. In addition, our post-doc Wendy Gonaver, PhD, is preparing for a Humanities Grand Rounds and an exhibition on Race and Racism at the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry and Strong Memorial Hospital in February 2024 for Black History Month. We hope you will join us for some of these activities, sign up to be informed about future events, and follow-us on Facebook and Instagram.

The task force called for increased transparency about the accuracy and limits of Al and outlined ways to ensure all people have access to Al medical devices that work for them.
