In January, we welcomed Christy Slobogin, PhD as our newest faculty member. Christy presented at the February Corner Society on "Something Useful in a National Sense: Percy Hennell's Plastic Surgery Photography as Propaganda" and, along with a number of other DHHBe faculty, completed her first 1st year selective. In February, it was announced that Patricia Lück MBChB, MPhil PallMed, MSc MedHum was awarded a University of Rochester 2year Dean's Teaching Fellowship (DTF) 2024-2026.
