

The latest treatments, guidelines and recommendations in various topics, such as: Helicobacter pylori treatment, screening colonoscopy, cirrhosis, obesity, liver transplant, pancreatic cysts and more will be discussed to develop quality and cost effective strategies for successful patient outcomes in 2017 and beyond.

At the conclusion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Discuss the updates on Helicobacter pylori treatment.
