The Dr. Lemuel & Gloria Rogers African American Health Symposium seeks to raise dementia concern and awareness among African Americans, and educate participants about the resources available in our community. The first African American Health Symposium took place in 2008 and was coordinated by Ralph and Mollie Richards, members of the Alzheimer's Ministry at Mt. Olivet Baptist Church.

In 2015, the symposium was named in honor of Dr. Lemuel Rogers, one of the first African American doctors to build and own a medical building in Rochester, and his wife Gloria. After Dr. Rogers' passing, the symposium was renamed to commemorate his and his wife's contributions to health education in the local African American community.
