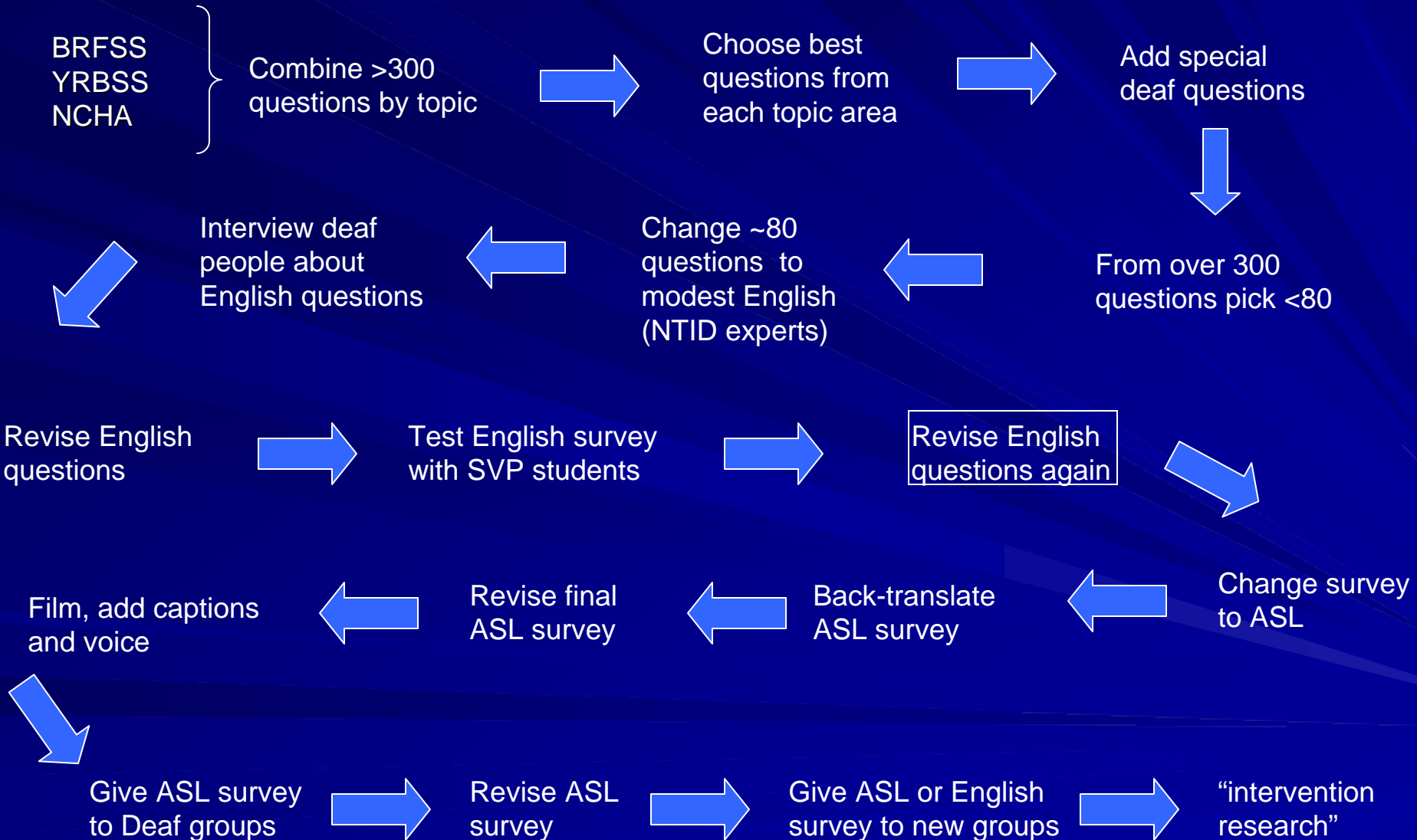

The Sticker

- Bilateral pure tone hearing loss averages
- California Reading Comprehension Test
- Michigan Language Test
- LCBQ (language-communication background questionnaire)

Completed Surveys

- 168 NTID freshmen (out of 190)
- 578 hearing RIT freshmen (out of 2200)
- 32 deaf/HOH RIT freshmen (out of 70)
- Analysis is proceeding
