Submission Guidelines

Workshop Proposals: All workshop proposals must be related to AI and Health. We welcome interdisciplinary perspectives and contributions that critically examine issues including, but not limited to:

- Human-Al relationships
- Al and mental healthcare
- Healthcare workforce displacement due to automation
- Algorithmic bias
- Al-related privacy risks
- Neuroethics and the ethics of digital technologies

All workshops are 90 minutes in length. Workshop proposals should include a title, 2-3 learning objectives for the session, and an overview of the content of the session, including the methods of audience/participant engagement that will be utilized.

Abstracts for Posters: Posters at the conference can address any topic in bioethics and the health humanities. Poster abstracts should include a title and either a structured, scientific abstract <u>OR</u> an unstructured abstract for a scholarly product from any humanities and bioethics disciplines, including but not limited to ethics, narratives, and arts-based posters.

All submissions must include the name and title/institutional affiliations for all authors, plus the contact information (preferred e-mail address and phone number) of any presenting authors. The word limit for workshop proposals and poster abstracts is 300 words. The 300-word limit does not include the title, learning objectives, or author/presenter information. Submissions should be prepared as a double-spaced Word document or PDF in 12-point font.
