

Master's in Nursing Education program



Teaching nurses how to teach.

OVERVIEW

The part-time, 35-credit Master's in Nursing Education program is designed for experienced working nurses who want to transition to a teaching role, either as a nurse educator in an academic setting or in a clinical teaching role. Graduates will be eligible for national CNE certification by meeting established nurse educator competencies.

CURRICULUM

The Nursing Education program is a hybrid online program, in which students will:

- learn the proven methods and technologies of effective teaching alongside other professionals in a variety of health care disciplines (courses are taught in collaboration with Warner Graduate School of Education and the School of Medicine and Dentistry)
- follow a cognitive apprenticeship model, and learn by observing, practicing, reflecting, and participating within a community of nurse educators
- complete coursework online, with some classroom time in the evenings for in-person support, to accommodate full-time work schedules
- complete a capstone project in the last semester based on career interests

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

- a bachelor's degree in nursing from an accredited college or university
- RN licensure within the United States or U.S. territory
- one year of clinical experience preferred
- CPR certification
- statistics course with a grade of C or above (Our *online, self-paced statistics course* can be completed in as little as four weeks)
- graduate-level writing course (may be taken as a non-matriculated course with NUR 401 – Writing Workshop course)
- undergraduate physical assessment course within the last 5 years or NSG 363 – Comprehensive Health Assessment Refresher (may be taken as a nonmatriculated course). Required before registering for NLX 422.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

ADMISSION CHECKLIST

To apply to the MNE Program, applicants will need to submit the following:

- current RN license
- official transcripts from all schools attended, including prerequisites (cumulative GPA of 3.0 preferred)
- two letters of recommendation
- professional goal statement
- resume or CV
- ☐ writing sample (academic paper or publication)
- for international students, TOEFL with a minimum score of 560 (paper-based), 230 (computer-based) or 88 (iBT)
