The Nurse Practitioner programs offer an innovative curriculum, in which students will:


- Choose from six specialty concentrations:

- Complete a portion of coursework online, with some classroom time in the evenings for in-person support, to accommodate full-time work schedules (program can be completed part or full time)

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

- Bachelor's degree in nursing from an accredited school of nursing
- RN licensure within the United States or U.S. territory
- Clinical experience for the following nurse practitioner specialties:
 - AGPCNP, FNP, PNP and FPMHNP programs: one year clinical experience is preferred
 - AGACNP program: one year full-time (or equivalent) RN experience in acute care prior to enrollment in NUR 411
 - PNP/NNP: two years NICU experience in the last five years
- CPR certification
- Statistics course with a grade of C or above (our *online*, *self-paced statistics* course can be completed in as little as four weeks)

ADMISSION CHECKLIST

To apply to the Nurse Practitioner Program, applicants will need to submit the following:

- current RN license
- official transcripts from all schools attended, including prerequisites (cumulative GPA of 3.0 preferred)
- two official letters of reference
- professional goal statement
- resume or CV
- writing sample (academic paper, clinical document or publication)
- of for international students, TOEFL with a minimum score of 560 (paper-based), 230 (computer-based) or 88 (iBT)
