

State Authority to Regulate a Licensed Profession

- Every State has the authority to regulate the qualifications of a profession
- Generally, states can either choose to set its own standards or incorporate the standards set though a national organization
- In addition to character and fitness, the qualification standards for a profession essentially fall into three main categories:
 - Education
 - Experience
 - Examination









State and National **Education** Requirements

NYS (education):

- Master's degree in ABA
- Or a Master's degree in a related field and an advanced certificate in ABA
- And from an approved program (programs have until September of 2019 to get registered with the state)
- Coursework in autism (after 2019)

BACB (education):

- Master's degree (in BA, ed, or psych)
- 270 classroom hours of graduate-level instruction in BA

Educational Programs: NYS Licensure Qualifying

- Pre-reviewed by Department of Professions (the Department)
- Coursework meets all the requirements set forth by NY
 - · Behavior Analysis Law
 - · Department regulations
- Students prequalified to sit for the NYS ABA licensing exams
- To find licensure qualifying programs in NY go to <u>Inventory of Registered Programs: Licensure</u> <u>Qualifying Programs</u>

Educational Programs: NYS Registered

- Educational programs in NY MUST be registered by the Department
- All currently registered programs that lead to masters or advanced certificate in ABA have until 8/31/2019 to become licensure qualifying
- Most are currently actively pursuing
- Until 2019 education will be accepted
- To find out if a program is registered in NY go to: <u>Inventory of Registered Programs:</u> <u>by Institution</u>

State and National Experience Requirements

New York

- Requires a MINIMUM of 150 hours of University Practicum before students can apply for a Limited Practice Permit (this can be applied for when all, but exam and/or experience hours have been completed)
- With this permit, the individual must acquire an additional 1350 hours of supervised experience in one year! Or apply for an extension of their Limited Practice Permit

BACB (options):

- Independent Field Experience
 - 1500 hours
 - 5% supervision every two weeks
- Practicum (university)
 - 1000 hours
 - 7.5% supervision every week
- Intensive Practicum (university)
- 750 hours
- 10% supervision two times per week

Question: What if my university program does not have a 150 hour practicum as part of the educational program?



Supervised Experience - NY requirements (Note: NY's requirements for supervision meeting time/face-to-face meeting time requirements are different from the BACB requirements)

- > 1500 experience hours same as the BACB
- 1:1 2x weekly 2 hours of individual meeting or observation
 1:1 can be during regular work activities of supervisee, as long as the activities observed are relevant and you're only observing one supervisee at a time
- Group supervision: NY allows for up to 1 hour of group supervision per week, but this is beyond the 2 hours of individual (so, a total of 3 hours of supervision meeting/observation time can be counted per week





If the Education Program is Not Registered in NYS

- The university must be regionally accredited
- Substantially equivalent (i.e., meet regulations for LBA/CBAA)
- Will obtain limited permit to complete any necessary supervised experience in NY
- Subject to individual review
- Additional requirements may be identified by the department and required before obtaining limited permit

NYS Supervised Experience for Students (in registered or licensure-qualifying programs) - Gaining experience under the student exemption

Where?

With Whom?

 Only in settings where there is an appropriate supervisor (see next slide for specific information) Only individuals with an autism diagnosis will count towards licensure even in when in exempt settings

Question: What if there are persons within the program I am working who do not have a diagnosis of autism or related disorder?

Requirements of the **Experience Supervisor**:

NYS (http://www.op.nysed.gov/prof/aba/subpart79-17.htm)

- > Experience obtained in NY
- The supervisor shall be a LBA; or
- An authorized health care practitioner who currently diagnoses, prescribes, or orders treatment involving applied behavior analysis in his or her professional practice
- Experience **obtained** in other jurisdictions: The supervisor shall be licensed in a profession authorized to provide applied behavior analysis services in the jurisdiction where the supervised experience occurs;
- The supervisor shall be the owner of, be employed by, or be retained by the entity providing the experience opportunities to the applicant,
- To prevent a potential conflict of interest, the supervisor shall not be a member of the applicant's family or an individual who has a close personal relationship with the applicant and/or his or her family.
- The supervisor cannot be paid by the supervisee

Application for NYS Licensure

- You should apply for a limited permit upon completion of all coursework and at least 150 hours of a university practicum (after August 2019).
- You need to submit your application for licensure before or at the same time as you submit your application for a limited permit.
- <u>Limited Permit (if you work</u>) <u>Sitting for Licensing Exam</u> in a non-exempt setting)
 - This will allow you to gain experience hours under the supervision of an LBA or other appropriate supervisor
 - You will have one year with which to gain your required experience hours.
- - The department will approve all coursework and experience and make available to you the exam(s)

NYS Limited Permit

- What it is
 - Allows the permit holder to practice in a non-exempt setting
 - Under the supervision of a LBA
- When to apply
- Apply when all coursework is completed
- After completing 150 university practicum hours (after August 31, 2019)
- At the same time or after the licensing application is submitted
- Prior to accruing hours after coursework is completed

State and National Exam Requirements NYS BACB 2 exams: BA exam One exam - the and autism exam BCBA exam or the BCaBA exam

 - pass an examination acceptable to the Board and the Department in accordance with the Commissioner's Regulations
 - LBA: 150 questions
 - · CBAA: 130 questions

LBA Board vs. NYSABA

- NYS LBA Board
 - The state licensing board for NY
 - Comprised of 7 members
 - Comprised of 7 members three licensed behavior analysts; one certified behavior analyst assistant; one licensed psychologist, who may currently prescribe treatment involving applied behavior and ysaich and two public representatives as defined in section 6508(1)(b) of the Education Law.
- NYSABA
 - NYSABA is the official representative for behavior analysis across New York
